



Standards on Climate Change Expenditure Tagging (CCET) of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao for mainstreaming Climate Change related activities in the Budgeting process.

Brief Background

- Coordination meeting with endorsing Authorities (Ministries).
- MENRE tasked to review and assess P/A/Ps of different Ministries related to ENRE prior to the submission of the respective Ministry's budget proposal.
- As Endorsing Authority, the MENRE shall endorse P/A/Ps of Ministries based on its set of standards/criteria to the Ministry of Finance, Budget and Management for inclusion in the respective Ministry's Budget Proposal.
- For the MENRE to set that standards/criteria including menu of P/A/Ps for qualification and admission.

Adoption of Specific Set of Criteria/Standards

- To ensure uniformity with that of national standards, the MENRE with minor revisions tailor-fit to the current competencies of the BARMM, **adopted the standards/parameters** set under the Climate Change Expenditure Tagging (CCET).
- A wholistic, climate responsive and environmentally conscious budgeting process;
 - ✓ identification and tracking of climate responsive expenditures
 - ✓ generate timely statistics and baseline information
 - ✓ facilitate the establishment of a CCE baseline for the region
 - ✓ support informed policy dialogue within and outside government.

CLIMATE CHANGE EXPENDITURE TAGGING (CCET)

- supports **mainstreaming** of Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation into the planning and budgeting process.

CLIMATE CHANGE

- ✓ is the global phenomenon of climate transformation characterized by the changes in the usual climate of the planet (regarding temperature, precipitation, and wind) that are especially caused by human activities.

CLIMATE CHANGE TWIN PILLAR

Mitigation

- ✓ reduce Greenhouse Gas emissions (GHG), directly or indirectly, by avoiding or capturing GHG before they are emitted to the atmosphere or sequestering already those in the atmosphere.

Adaptation

- ✓ reduce the vulnerability of human or natural systems to the impacts of climate change and climate related risks.

1. Policy, Development and Governance

- empower stakeholders to take action through the development, adoption, monitoring and review of policies, plans, regulations, administrative orders and/or executive orders.

2. Research, Development and Extension

- generation, management and sharing of information.

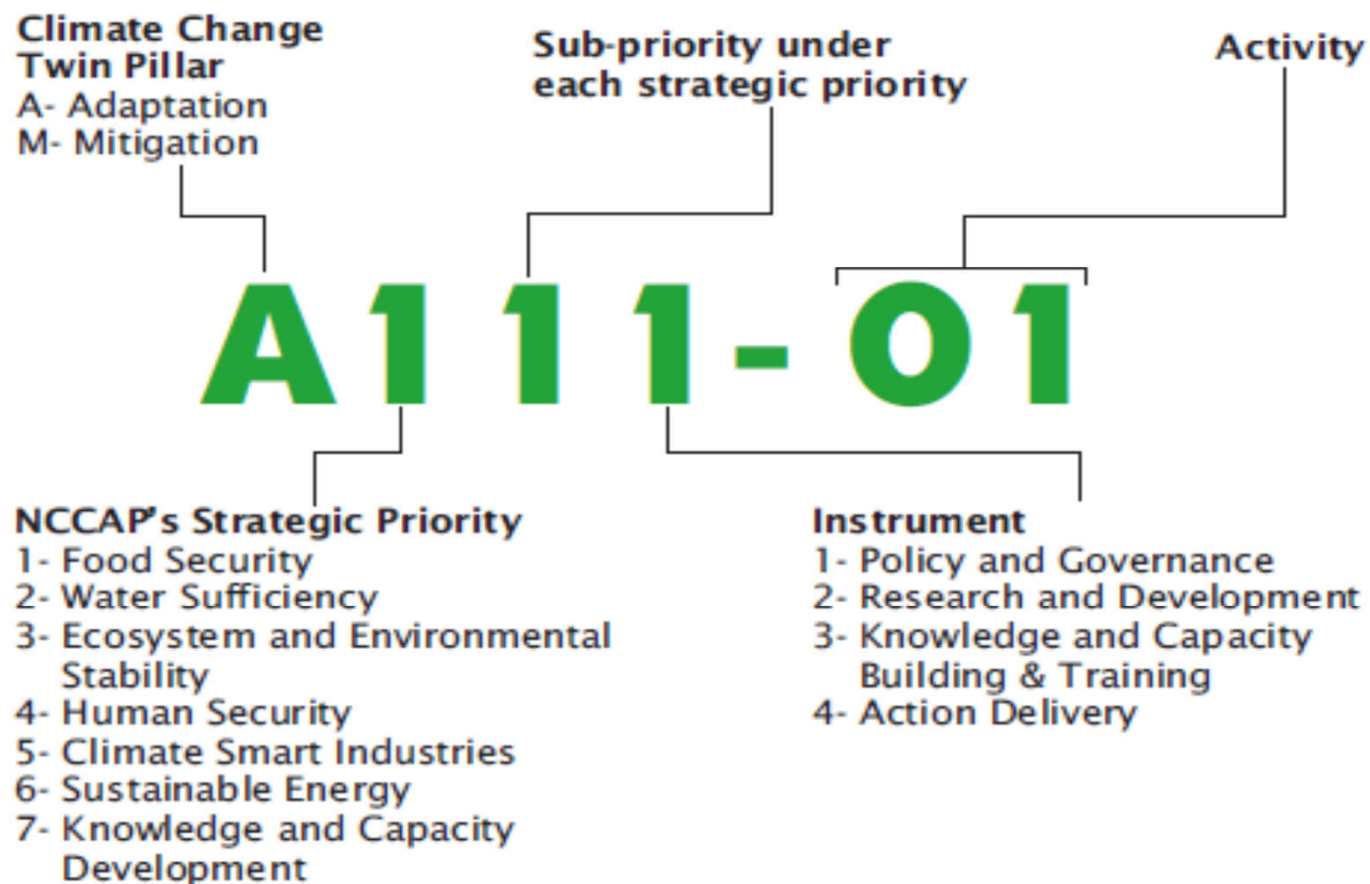
3. Knowledge Sharing and Capacity Building

- institutional capacity to implement climate action, including dissemination, awareness-raising and training activities focused on knowledge update.

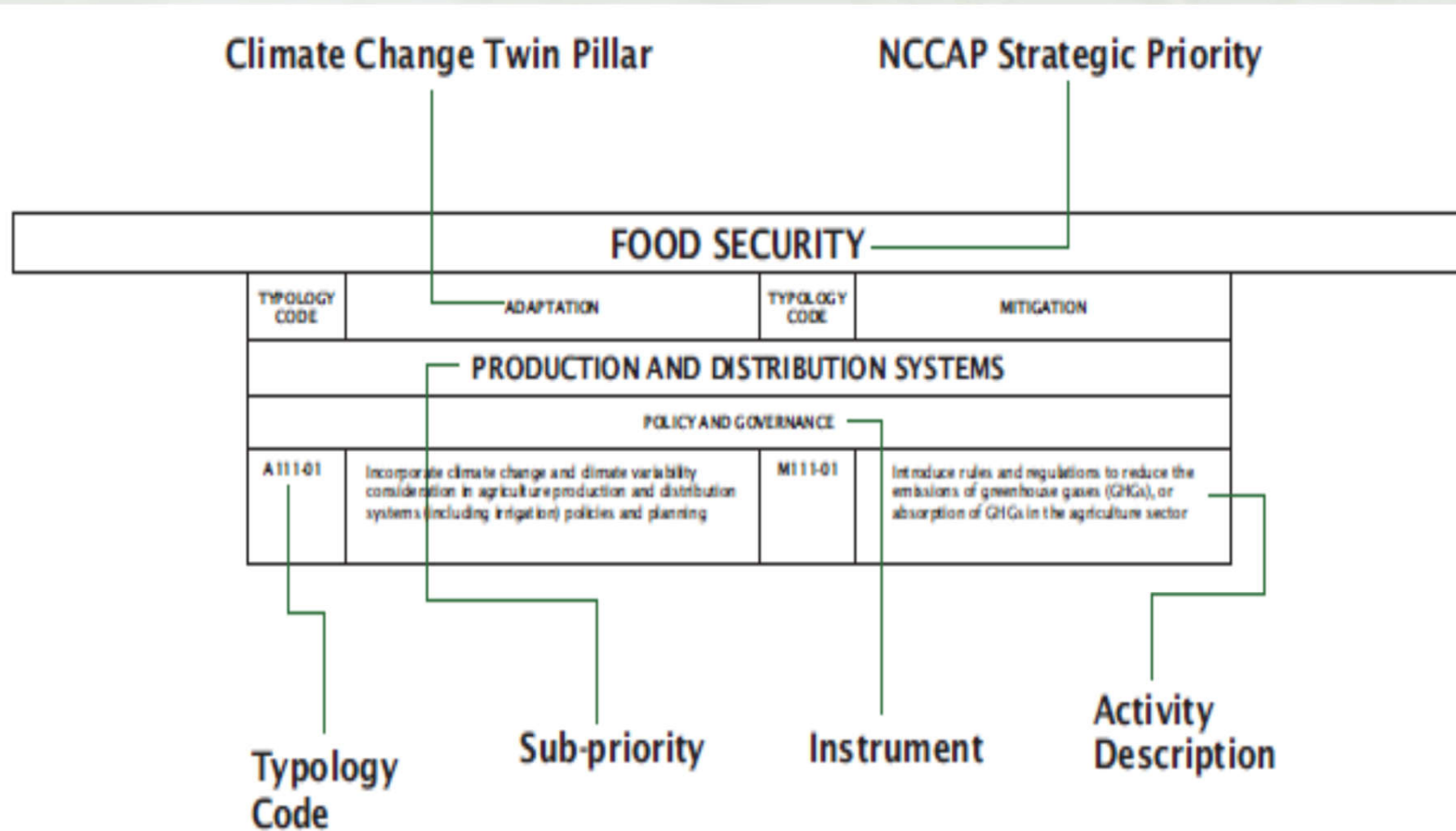
4. Service/Action Delivery

- activities that directly mitigate greenhouse gas/sequester carbon, or reduce risk, vulnerability or increase adaptive capacity.

PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

Ministries when proposing climate change related programs, activities and projects shall;

- ✓ **Identify, prioritize** and **tag** climate change programs, activities and projects for the year.
- ✓ **Submit Bangsamoro Budget Proposal Form No. 500**, Climate Change Expenditure and indicate in partial or in full amount of climate change related P/A/P guided by the Climate Change Typologies in the Annex A of DBM Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2015-01;
- ✓ **Accomplish** and **submit** the Bangsamoro Budget Proposal Form No. 710, Proposal for New National-funded project for each proposed P/A/Ps relating to climate change

PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

Ministries when proposing climate change related programs, activities and projects shall;

- ✓ **Attached** duly accomplished Quality Assurance and Review Form (QRF). This form clarifies the objectives and coverage of the tagged P/A/P and identifies its interconnection with adaptation or mitigation.
